### S2\_Table. Pearson correlations between plant functional traits and leaf economics.

Leaf economics is the first axis of a PCA including specific leaf area (SLA), leaf dry matter content (LDMC), stem specific density (SSD), leaf nitrogen per unit mass (leaf  $N_{\text{mass}}$ ), and leaf phosphorus per unit mass (leaf  $P_{\text{mass}}$ ).
