Table S2: Probabilities and conditional probabilities. PC stands for profile class and NPC for neighbor profile class. Part (A): The eight entries give the relative frequency of each PC in an image of the diagnosis MCcHL (ID = 1721). For example, 31,6% of the 10,860 cells are small, round (PC = 0). Part (B): The 64 entries give the conditional probabilities, P(NPC = j | PC= i), to find an NPC = j for a PC = i. The conditional probability is approximated by P(NPC = j | PC = i) = f(i, j)/f(i), where f(i, j) is the frequency of pairs (PC = i, NPC = j) in the neighborhood list. For example, the nearest neighbor of a small, round PC (PC = 0) is as well small, round (NPC = 0) with a probability of 0.354.
